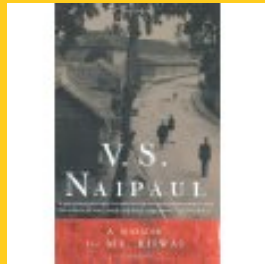

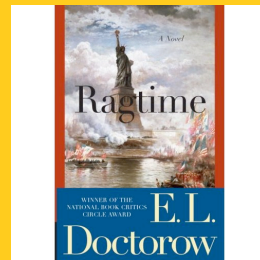


**A HOUSE FOR MR.

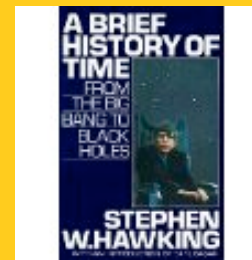


RAGTIME

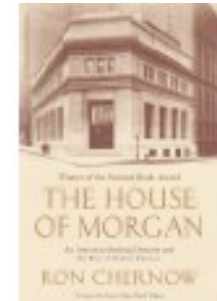
